second part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the
sum of seventy five Dollars to me the said Mary Mather
in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents
do grant bargain & sell unto the said Nathan Pear
man a certain tract or parcel of land lying and
being in the County aforesaid and on the waters of Adams
containing seventy five acres of land and bounded as
follows to wit Beginning at two Hickories out of one
root corner to surveys Long grove tract thence with
Charles Faires line N 40 W 34 1/2 poles to two post
stakes corner to said Faires thence N 60 W 68 poles
to a Black Jack thence S 30 W 119 poles to a post oak
in James L Morris line thence with his line S 75 E
160 poles to a stake in a line of John Duncan Long
grove tract thence with his line N 10 W 98 poles
beginning said Duncan corner to the Beginning
to have and to hold the foregoing tract or parcel
of land together with all and singular the appur
tenances thereto belonging or in any wise
appertaining unto him the said Pearman his
heirs and assigns forever And the said Mary Mather
