This Indenture made and entered into this day of 1850 between Henry Miller and Mary Miller his wife, Christopher Miller, Permillia Miller, Samuel R. Miller and Rebecca Miller his wife, Andrew Miller, Richard Brown and Lucinda Brown his wife, William McElva Fogle and Elizabeth Fogle his wife, John Jenkins and Malinda Jenkins, his wife, John Miller, William R. Miller and Gilly Miller his wife; heirs of William Miller deceased of the first part and James M. Waggoner of the 2nd part witness that we the parties of the 1st. Part for our consideration of the several sum herein afore mentioned to us in hand paid by the said James M. Waggoner the party of the second part that is to say to the said Henry Miller the sum of eighteen dollars & 76 cents, to the said Christopher Miller thirty dollars, to the said Permillia Miller the sum of seventeen dollars, to the same Samuel R. Miller twenty five dollars, to the same Andrew Miller fifteen dollrs, to the said Richard Brown and Lucinda Brown his wife twenty five dollars, to the same William McKelvey Fogle and wife thirty dollars, to John Jenkins and his wife thirty dollars, to John Miller thirty dollars and to William R. Miller and wife thirty dollars the receipt thereof is hereby acknowledged. Have this day bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell and convey unto the said James M. Waggoner heirs their several undivided shares it being one eleventh part each in and to a certain tract or parcel of land which has descended to us from William Miller deceased their father, it being part of Phillip Phillip 200 acre survey situated lying and being in the county of same and State of Ky. And 13 bounded as follows by beginning at a stake in the middle of Nolynn where Joseph Sarvis line said creek thence 560E70 poles....with Joseph Sarves line to a stone corner to William Stewards fence with his line S30W150 poles to the white oaks and the small hickory thence N57 ½ W220poles to a stake in the middle of Nolynn 11 poles below the Big Spring thence up the main channel of the creek to the beginning containing 100 acres more or less to have and to hold the above named tract or parcel of land it being one eleventh parts each to him the said Waggoner, his heirs or assigns forever and we the party of the first part further covenant and agree to and with the said Waggoner that we will warrant forever defend the title to the above named undivided shares against them selves, their heirs or any other persons claiming under them or any other way.

In testimony we have hereunto set our hands and seals this day and date above written.
