Jacob Wright (1722-78) in 1776 commanded the 6th company of militia under Col. Philip Van Cortland and, 1778, was killed by a British Light Horseman. He was born in Stephentown, N. Y.

Aaron Rumrill (1742-1800) responded to the Lexington Alarm as a private in Capt. Daniel Whiting's company, Col. Jonathan Brewer's regiment, and, 1776-77, served several other enlistments under different commands. He was born in Dorchester; died in Roxbury, Mass.

Thomas Rumrill (1762-1849) served as musician in Col. Henry Jackson's regiment. He was at the surrender of Burgoyne. He was born in Dorchester; died in Roxbury, Mass.

Nathaniel Felton (1714-1807) was a member of Committee of Correspondence, 1772. He was born in Salem; died in Roxbury, Mass.

Thomas Clapp (1713-98) served as a private in Capt. William Holden's company, Colonel Robinson's regiment. He was born and died in Dorchester, Mass.

Nathaniel Livermore (1713-83) a patriot who paid money to hire soldiers to fill the Continental battalions. He was born in Watertown; died in Waltham.

John Livermore (1761-1807) enlisted, 1778, as a private in Capt. Abraham Pierce's company, Col. Samuel Thatcher's regiment. He was born in Waltham; died in Roxbury, Mass.

Nathan Morse (1728-83) responded to the Lexington Alarm as a private in Capt. Amariah Fuller's company. He was born and died in Newton, Mass.

Hercules Mooney (1710-1800), who had served in the seven years' war, was a member of the Committee of Safety and House of Representatives; also appointed lieutenant-colonel of New Hampshire troops, 1776, and colonel, 1779. He was born in Ireland; died in Holderness, N. H.

Jonathan Mooney (1744-1823) served several enlistments as a private. He was born in Lee; died in Eaton, N. H.

James Jackson (1721-91) was a signer of the Association Test of Rochester, N. H., and one of the incorporators of Eaton. He was born in Enfield, Conn.; died in Eaton, N. H.

Joseph Clark (1754-1847) enlisted, 1777, in Capt. Jeremiah Post's company. In 1780 he served in the defense of West Point. He died in Eaton, N. H.

Henry Allard was a signer of the Association Test of Rochester and was living in 1784.

David Allard (1746-1831) gave six months' service, 1780, as a private from Rochester, where he was born. He died in Eaton.
